First Grade Supply List - IN SCHOOL

Please have the following with your student on the first day of school so we can get our learning started right away!

- o 3 composition notebooks 1 black, 1 red, 1 green (Students will have reading, math, and science/ss journals; if cannot find those colors, use red and green marker on tops/bottoms of 2 notebooks to designate)

 * If your student has difficulty with letter formation, you might consider a Primary notebook which will have wider lines for handwriting work.
- o 3 poly/plastic folders with prongs for Home<->School & Writing
- o 3 paper folders.
- o (at least) I pack black Expo dry erase markers (4 or 6 pack)
- 0 1 pack of 24 pencils (regular #2 please. Decorated pencils damage our pencil sharpener!)
- o 124-count box of crayons
- o (at least) 2 packs of 3x3 sticky notes
- o 2 large pink erasers
- 0 8 glue sticks
- o I kid's scissors
- o I pair of headphones (Earbuds acceptable, but have proven incompatible with some tech in past)
- o 2 rolls of paper towels
- o 2 boxes of tissues
- hand sanitizer
- o Last Names A-L: baby wipes, gallon-sized ziplock bags, white copy paper
- Last Names M-Z: Lysol/Clorox wipes, quart-sized ziplock bags, colored copy paper
- An old shirt for painting in art class (labeled)

** In a zipper-sealed bag, a change of clothing to be kept in backpack throughout the year in case of emergency.

** Please label your child's book bag, any sweaters or jackets, and lunch boxes.

ALL SUPPLIES MUST BE REMOVED FROM PACKAGING and LABELED with your child's name. Please create TWO separate gallon-sized ziplock bags for your student:

- supplies for immediate use (3-5 sharpened pencils, I eraser, I glue stick, scissors, crayons, I dry erase marker, headphones, I sticky note stack)
- 2) supplies for future use (the rest of your child's small supplies listed above)

In the event of at-home learning, students will need the above learning materials AND a personal dry erase board (These can be purchased online or at the dollar store. A picture frame with a blank white piece of paper inside will also work!)

You may also find the following useful and/or necessary for your student:

- mouse and mouse pad if the trackpad is tricky for your child.
- Additional dry erase markers
- Additional copy paper if you choose to print materials
- Additional headphones
- Additional notebook
- Letter tiles for phonics
